Friends of Stonehouse Park

Friends of Stonehouse Park run free events within the park for families to attend such as: Easter Hunt, themed story telling with related arts and crafts on the recently restored bandstand, Duck Race during Gala week, Bandstand Beatz, Halloween and Elf Day.

PAMIS Lanarkshire

Pamis work with people with profound and multiple learning disabilities and complex health needs. Access and opportunities are poor for this group - across Scotland, this is something PAMIS have worked hard to change especially in Lanarkshire.

Calderwood Green Spaces Volunteers

The group were set up to raise the profile of the green spaces that make up part of the Calderwood Estate including the new Glen Esk Pocket Park, to campaign for and support the existing facilities as well as to link up the various green spaces, making it easier for people to access Calderglen Country Park by foot and bicycle.

Partnership & Collaboration

Hamilton Judo Club Inclusion Development Programme In February 2024, the Club launched the Inclusion Development Programme in partnership with South Lanarkshire Leisure and Culture (SLLC) and South Lanarkshire Disability Sport (SLDS). This innovative programme offers opportunities for schools and Social Care Centres to work with the coaches and volunteers on fundamental motor skills using judo as the focus.

Agape Wellbeing/ The Village Centre

Both of these organisations have offered tremendous projects in TATTA (free Arts course Held in both The Village Centre and Agape Wellbeing) and Roads to Recovery (free yoga), and Time to Tackle, breaking down barriers and the stigma of mental health and social isolation.

Blue Triangle & GIVIT

The GIVIT youth recovery steering group was set up in partnership with South Lanarkshire ADP and Blue Triangle. The GIVIT was set up to provide support for young people from 13 – 25 years in a recovery from substance use.

Swaddle

Swaddle is a trusted, well-established, first choice destination for preloved children's clothes, toys, and equipment.

LDVG Transport Department

In 2018, a consultation in the Strutherhill area of Larkhall identified transport as a major barrier for older people accessing food shops.

Funding was secured to pilot a shopping service, where volunteer drivers not only provided transport support but helped with carrying shopping.

St Mary's for All SCIO

St. Mary's for All in Hamilton exemplifies the effective use of enterprise and sustainability to sustain vital community services and achieve significant social impact.

LEAP LEAP was set up by local older people to deliver health and education services aimed specifically at their own age group.

The Whitehill Activity Group Whitehill Activity Group are a grassroots entity deeply rooted in the lives of the people of Whitehill, understanding their challenges and aspirations on a profound level.

Fibro Friends Lanarkshire Fibro Friends Lanarkshire is a local group, recently set up, to highlight the plight of people suffering from Fibromyalgia and other hidden disabilities.
